

Robert Saalfeld

More than 60 years ago, during a high school trip from his hometown of Salem, Oregon, Robert unexpectedly witnessed a Night March in St. Augustine, Florida. Black and white demonstrators marched peacefully around the Old Slave Market while facing jeers, threats, and violence from Segregationists.

In a letter home to his mother he wrote, "...the Negroes showed in a dignified manner that they have pride in their race and demand treatment as human beings..."

After returning in July 2024 for the 60th Anniversary Commemoration of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, he now returns again to share his powerful story.
